As the year comes to an end, it is so rewarding to reflect on all the lives that have been saved and made better because of our rescue work.

Though donations were down and times were tough, we continued to stay focused on our mission "Helping animals in need!" We had to make some big changes and find creative ways to get things done, but here we are with a lot of great success stories and we are so proud to say, "We are surviving the recession!"

We still have some big financial needs, we aren't out of the woods yet and we still need your help. Without your support, the future of Animal Agents is uncertain. The reality is it takes a lot of money to do what we do and we can't do it alone. We are hopeful that things will start looking up and together, we will be able to continue making a difference for animals in need.



One of our biggest, most recent accomplishments was finding an outlet in the bay area to adopt out pets. Every weekend over the past few months, we loaded up the van with 8-10 dogs at a time and took them in to San Francisco to show on Saturdays in one location and on Sundays in another.

We were nervous at first not knowing what to expect but we are happy to announce, the results were even better than we could have ever anticipated. We met amazing, responsible, animal-loving people who couldn't say enough great things about our dogs. Dogs who have been stuck at our sanctuary for a long time and who were getting no attention on peffinder, were getting adopted within a few hours of arriving.

Since we are very picky about where each pet goes, we would interview the potential adopter asking serious and qualifying questions. We would check references and many of them got the thumbs up right away from the store owners. They know their clients and they know they are good pet owners. Each day after the adoption event, we would deliver the dogs that got adopted to their new homes giving us a chance to visit with the new owners, do a home visit and see how the dog was going to live. In some cases, we allowed the dog to go home with their new owner right away, but we would stop by later that evening to check in.

Realistically it takes a couple of weeks for everyone to settle into a routine, so we stayed in touch during that time to answer questions, work through issues and be supportive. Our first responsibility is to the pet making sure they are safe, happy and adjusting in their new home.

Our goal is to continue to take pets up for adoption on a regular basis and now that we've adopted out so many dogs we are going to start adding cats to the mix with the anticipation of having the same great results.

The best thing about all this is it has changed the way we are doing things at Animal Agents. It has reduced the overwhelming number of animals being housed on the property at a time. It's created a more pleasant, less stressful environment that has allowed us to focus on those in need of more training and socialization so they too will find their forever homes.



Of course none of this would be possible without the ongoing support of people like you. To keep doing what we do, we must continue to ask for help and appreciate your generosity. Together we can continue making a difference one pet at a time! Thank you and have a blessed Holiday Season!
